TH: 520 New Testament Interpretation: The Life & Message of Jesus

An introduction to the writings of the New Testament as expressions of faith and witness centering on the person and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth. In addition to surveying the major features and themes of many New Testament books, the course will introduce students to the critical study of the New Testament texts. A major aim of the course is to help students integrate skills of critical investigation with an appreciation for the New Testament as the Christian community's proclamation of God's act of salvation in Jesus of Nazareth.

TH: 530 History of Christian Thought I

A study of Christian theology in its cultural and institutional context up through the Middle Ages. The story of the church's self-understanding through time. Special emphasis will be given to the faith of the early church, Nicea and Chalcedon, to the rise of the Augustinian and Thomistic traditions, to monastic spirituality, and to women leaders in the early and medieval church.
